The eight selected articles are as follows;

REFORMULATION OF THE SOCIAL SAFETY NET: A CONCEPTUAL APPROACH BASED ON QUR'ANIC VALUES. This examines the social safety net in the Qur'an and some essential values that can be realized as role models in contemporary modern life, which are approached contextually and critically by examining primary texts to interpreted thematically- contextually such as *zakah, kafarat, infaq, sadaqah, qurban, dam, fi dyah, fai'*, and *ghanimah* which are based on the principles of expansion and balance, justice and equity, spirituality and productivity, sustainability and empowerment, as well as dynamic and systematic which is not only short term but also long term, not only consumptive but also productive empowerment.

THE ROLE OF MAFINDO (MASYARAKAT ANTI-FITNAH INDONESIA) IN MAINTAINING RELIGIOUS HARMONY. It examines the important role of the anti-hoax community (MAFINDO) in

maintaining religious harmony, and uses content analysis to display several group posts on social media as cyber-police, as an active, peaceful, and prosperous civil society mobilizer. It plays an important role to fight against fraud and hatred, as well as an enlightener against the epidemic of hoaxes. With this role, the public can be digitally literate about content and misinformation circulating in the community.

LOCAL MITIGATION OF PANDEMIC FOR SUSTAINABLE PUBLIC HEALTH ACCORDING TO JAVANESE CULTURE AND BELIEF. This article examines the pattern of mitigation in Javanese culture, through health anthropology about the disease, namely by describing local ways to prevent and overcome disease outbreaks or mitigate disease outbreaks physically and psychologically. Physical mitigation tends to be in line with modern medical methods and the application of the new normal. Psychic mitigation is done by using mantra and chants and developing the Javanese attitude of *narima ing pandum* (taking for granted).

PESANTREN TANGGUH AS MODERATE ISLAMIC EDUCATION INSTITUTION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC. This article examines the moderate character through the attitudes, mindset, and behavior of the residents of the Pesantren Tangguh related to the symbolic, cultural, social, and economic modalities in controlling the Covid-19 pandemic crisis at Pesma Al-Hikam and Pesantren Sabilurrosyad in Malang by combining destiny and endeavor in harmony by actively carrying out all activities in Islamic boarding schools without ignoring health protocols, as well as well-established economic independence in meeting needs and social assistance.

JAVANESE FAMILY ETHICS IN SERAT SALOKATAMA. This article explores the Javanese ethical values in maintaining harmony in family life through Mangkunegara IV's Serat Salokatama, which is built through religious values as the foundation of other noble values, such as honesty, vigilance, patience, courtesy, kindness, humility, toughness and unyielding, as well as humble. In addition, it was also informed that interactive and constructive dialogue is the key to maintaining a good family life.

THE ANALYSIS OF ISLAMIC THEOLOGY TOWARD MANDI SAFAR RITUAL IN AKIT TRIBAL BENGKALIS-RIAU, this article examines the description and analysis of the influence of Islamic theology on the ritual of Mandi Safar through the Qur'an and Hadith on the island of Rupert as a tradition to avoid rejecting reinforcements, which arises because of the belief that the month of safar is a month of illness, so it is necessary to perform a ritual of self-cleaning through bathing. It is wrapped with religious legitimacy through readings that must be recited from selected surah, prayers of salvation and refusal of reinforcements', and ablution that is oriented to obtain safety and prevent bad luck.

MITIGATING POVERTY: THE CLUSTERING OF POTENTIAL ZAKAT IN INDONESIA, this article examines the use of the fuzzy c-means clustering (FCM) method to determine the optimal cluster accuracy of zakat potential in Indonesia from bank deposits, salaries, agricultural and plantation products, and staple foods in 34 provinces, which confirms 2 optimal clusters for zakat potential. In Indonesia, where cluster 2 has more members than cluster 1, the potential for zakat is higher. This method is considered to be able to provide optimal results to strengthen the strategy of collecting zakat.

ASWAJA'S VALUES FRAME-BASED ACCOUNTING CASE STUDY AT THE NAHDLATUL ULAMA UNIVERSITY IN INDONESIA, this article examines the practice of accounting based on the values of Ahlussunnah wal jama'ah (aswaja) using an interpretive paradigm and a case study approach at

the Nahdlatul Ulama college by modifying the analysis of the Seidel and Yin approaches that have an impact on social behavior consisting of the values of I'tidal, Tawassuth, Tawazun, Tasamuh and amar ma'ruf nahi munkar, with the form of adherence to principles, budget compatibility with work programs and strategic plans, system clarity accounting, the use of the concept of budget deliberation, fikroh islahiyah, the principle of balance, markaziyah accounting, taqiya, and honesty.

Eight quite interesting articles are connected to each other based on research and have a novelty that is quite challenging to read. Hopefully, it is useful. Thank you.
